Dear Parent/Carer,

We are now approaching the end of an extremely busy term. Year 11 pupils have studied hard for their mock examinations. Please note that the examination boards have introduced a contingency day for the summer examination series, which is 26th June 2019. Anyone taking external examinations in Summer 2019 will need to be available on this date. A contingency date is a day specifically set aside, should sustained national or local disruption arise during the June 2019 examination series. If disruption happens, the GCSE and/or GCE (A Level) examinations would be taken either for the first time or again on that day.
