Dear Parent/Carer,

I would like to begin with a reminder that students will not attend school on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> December 2022 as the school is closed for a staff training day.

As we approach the final two weeks of a busy term, we are preparing for some special events. Our OAP Christmas Party will take place for the first time in three years on Monday 5<sup>th</sup> December. The Walsall Civic Service will now take place as a Civic Carol Service in St. Matthew's on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> December beginning at 10.45a.m.

We also continue with our appeal for donations to the local foodbank, current food bank shortages include: tinned meat, tinned fruit, tinned puddings, cooking sauces (like pasta sauce), jam, shower gel, shampoo, UHT milk, fruit juice and mashed or tinned potato. Donations can be given to Mrs Homer between now and Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> December.

The school canteen will be serving Christmas lunch to students and staff on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> December.
