BM1: A stable careers programme

Intent Statement

'All students are equipped to make informed choices regarding their future destinations. Students have a clear understanding of the options available to them and have the skills to navigate the best route for them to be successful throughout their lifetime. The careers programme will support to ensure they are able to gain meaningful employment with job satisfaction, with the skills and abilities required to be able to adapt and evolve throughout a working lifetime to achieve more highly skilled or highly paid opportunities.'

The aims of the careers programme:

- Students will receive a full careers programme delivered through PD Days, form-time, futures events and visits/ trips.
- Students will receive careers guidance in KS4. Students that continue into KS5 will receive further guidance and support. This is completed by our independent Careers adviser Carol Facey, in school on Wednesdays and Fridays.

 - Students in Y9 are able to book appointments to support with options processes and all other years can access careers guidance during breaktime and lunchtime or book a guidance meeting if required.
- Our Careers programme is personalised and responsive to student needs. It caters for all and is inclusive. Students of all abilities, all levels, all programmes and pathways are supported with destination routes and pathways. We support, recognise and celebrate all possible routes not just routes to university. Personalised support is provided for routes into education, training, apprenticeships and employment.


• The future skills questionnaires will be completed annually by students, and this will be used to review the provision and amend the careers programme/ provision.
