Subject: History

Overview

At Key Stage 3 we have created schemes of work that allow pupils to reflect on the most important events of the past while reflecting on the importance of studying history and its relevance today. We feel it is important that students gain an understanding of Britain's development and how this has shaped the society which they live in, with particular focus on incorporating a rich and diverse story that speaks directly to our students' culture and heritage. We reflect upon the histories of different countries and cultures to develop a clear understanding of the past. To aid student's exploration of British history we use a range of key questions to focus their studies.

For example, students explore the following questions:

- Who migrated to Britain?
- How did William conquer and gain control after of England after 1066?
- What was it like to live in Medieval England?
- Why were the Crusades significant?
- What was the Magna Carta and why does its creation been the started on
- democracy?
- Who were the Tudors?

To support the student's investigations, we work on developing a range of historical skills such as using historical information to development their ability to create and validate their arguments about the past, the ability to analyse and interpret historical interpretations and primary sources, as well as fostering independent learning skills.
